'The Missing Dead' has been developed by experts at Newcastle University and the Vindolanda Trust and takes the player back in time from the discovery of the skeleton in 2010 to the 3<sup>rd</sup> century AD. Using archaeological evidence excavated from Vindolanda, the game uses 2D, hand-drawn animation in a comic-book style to recreate Vindolanda as it would have been in c.230AD. the app is aimed at Key Stage 2 students (7-11 year olds) but can be enjoyed by any age.
